Dear Members

Welcome to our first newsletter for 2021.

The first month of the new year has been a difficult one for all South Africans. The coronavirus pandemic has escalated and the second wave has led to further restrictions for all citizens, and particularly for the racing industry.

Once again, owners are not able to see our horses run in person, but rather have to watch them from the comfort of our homes.

This has resulted in some innovative broadcasting and event initiatives. The L'Ormarin's Queen's Plate Racing Festival which took place in early January was very well received by owners and other participants alike, who were forced to watch from home but still managed to enjoy the days' racing and entertainment.

With racing still behind closed doors, the Cape Town Met, brought to you by Cape Racing, will follow a similar format with a dedicated feed on www.tellytrack.com or DSTV Tellytrack channel 249. An uninterrupted live stream will also be available at www.caperacing.co.za

The iconic "Met", is a 2000m event with a proud history which will be staged at Kenilworth Racecourse on Saturday 30 January 2021, together with other prestigious G1 contests. The 1000m Cape Flying Championships (WFA) for specialist

speed merchants and the Majorca Stakes (WFA) which has attracted a cast of fine fillies and mares over 1600m. Other feature races on the day include the G2 Western Cape Stayers over 2800m, the G3 Politician Stakes over 1800m and the Listed Summer Juvenile Stakes over 1000m.

As we move into the second month of the new year, we shift back to the Highveld for the Summer-Autumn feature season. This includes the running of the first leg of the World Sports Betting Triple Crown and the Wilgerbosdrift Triple Tiara. The WSB Gauteng Guineas (G2) and the Wilgerbosdrift Gauteng Fillies Guineas (G2) will be run at Turffontein Racecourse on Saturday the 6th of February. The Tommy Hotspur Handicap (G3) will also be run on that day over 1000m. More news on Highveld Feature Season Stakes can be found on pages 2 & 3.

I take this opportunity to advise all members in good standing that the RA Board has decided to forego membership fees for the current season entirely. With limitations on benefits available to members under prevailing circumstances, a decision was taken to focus on increasing and implementing a variety of new initiatives and innovative advantages to being an RA member. These are to be rolled out in the coming months and membership fees will be reinstated for the 2021/2022 racing season. Invoices will be sent out in June for the period 1 August 2021 to 31 July 2022. In the interim, we encourage current members to promote joining the RA to their non-member racing partners and patrons. We want to create a successful and interactive membership experience for all owners and so it is vital that owners are added to our data

base and receive regular updates and communications.

In closing, I would like to thank all owners who agreed to participate in our on-going research project. Big boost to Highveld feature race stakes

There is good news regarding feature race stakes on the Highveld this month. The total prize money for the 37 feature races which comprise the 2021 Highveld Summer-Autumn Feature Season has been increased by 43%.

The season kicks off with the first legs of the World Sports Betting SA Triple Crown and the Wilgerbosdrift SA Triple Tiara on Saturday 6 February and continues until Saturday 1 May, when Champions Day will bring down the curtain on three months of quality racing.

A total of R6.4 million was originally allocated to the 37 races, but an increased contribution from Phumelela and the World Sports Betting and Wilgerbosdrift sponsorships have enabled total prize money to be increased by R2.74 million to R9.135 million.

World Sports Betting (WSB), who support feature races around the country, have agreed to sponsor this year's SA Triple Crown, a series of races long billed as South Africa's ultimate test for three-year-olds.

The full sponsorship amount paid by WSB has been utilised to boost the prize money of the series, which is the richest in Africa and comprises three legs over distances ranging from 1600m to 2450m in the space of two months.

In order to encourage the participation of Cape-based runners there are alternate first legs - the Cape Guineas over 1600m at Kenilworth in Cape Town and the Gauteng Guineas over 1600m at Turffontein. The Cape leg of the current series in December was won by Russian Rock.

The second and third legs are the WSB SA Classic over 1800m and the WSB SA Derby over 2450m respectively, both at Turffontein.

There's a R2-million bonus awaiting the horse who has the speed, stamina and courage to triumph in all three legs.

Three horses have won the Triple Crown. The mighty Horse Chestnut, who many rank the best horse in South African racing history, won the inaugural event in 1999. Louis The King banked the bonus in 2014 and Abashiri repeated the feat in 2016.

Racehorse breeder, owner and horseracing benefactor Mary Slack will this season again sponsor the SA Triple Tiara under the banner of her Wilgerbosdrift Stud in Piketberg on the west coast in the Western Cape.

Wilgerbosdrift has sponsored the SA Triple Tiara since 2015. The series is a mirror image of the SA Triple Crown, except it is restricted to three-year-old fillies.

The full Wilgerbosdrift sponsorship has been set aside to boost the prize money of the series, which is the richest for three-year-old fillies in Africa and comprises three legs over distances ranging from 1600m to 2450m.

As with the Triple Crown, there are alternate first legs - the World Sports Betting Cape Fillies Guineas over 1600m at Kenilworth in Cape Town and the Gauteng Fillies Guineas over 1600m at Turffontein. The Cape leg of the current series was run in December and won by Captain's Ransom.

The second leg is the Wilgerbosdrift SA Fillies Classic over 1800m with the Wilgerbosdrift SA Oaks over 2450m completing the series.

There's a R1-million bonus for winning all three legs, which has been accomplished by three fillies to date. Igugu was the first to succeed in 2011 followed by Cherry On The Top in 2013 and Summer Pudding last year.

Interestingly Summer Pudding's dam, Cherry On The Cake, is a half-sister to Cherry On The Top.

On behalf of owners and all racing stakeholders we wish to thank both WBS and Wilgebosdrift for their generous sponsorships.




