Dear Members

Welcome to the October edition of RA Today.

I would like to congratulate all of our feature race winners during the month and look forward to the lead-ins for upcoming feature races.

This Friday, the 29th of October sees the running of the Nelson Mandela Bay Racing Algoa Cup (L) over 2000m and the Racing Association Stakes (L) over 1600m. The Racing Association has proudly contributed to the stakes of both these races with R100 000 and R50 000 respectively. This popular Fairview raceday also sees the running of the Cradock Place Stakes (NBT) and the Wedgewood Handicap (NBT).

Feature racing then moves to the Highveld on Saturday with no less than 6 feature races and 3 RA Bonus races to be run at Turffontein. The Allied Steelrod - Onamission Mile (G2) run over 1600m is the main feature on the day. The RA was pleased to contribute R200 000 to the stake of this race. Other feature races on the day are the Graham Beck Stakes (G3), the HSH Princess Charlene Starling Stakes (G3), the Yellowwood Handicap (G3), the Golden Loom Handicap (L) and the Java Stakes (L). The RA also contributed R50 000 to the stake of each of the Grade 3 races and R25 000 to the stake of each of the Listed Races. We look forward to an exciting and profitable day's racing.

During the month of October The Racing Association contributed R590 000 to minor stakes in the Western Cape and a further R225 000 to minor stakes and R150 000 to feature stakes in the Eastern Cape. A total of R600 000 was added to feature races on the Highveld as we continue to play a vital role in support of the industry. To date we have paid out R52 500 in RA bonuses with more bonus races scheduled during the course of the season.

This month I am delighted to announce a new basis for the awarding of the equine categories for the Equus Awards going forward. The new method will be based on a similar model to the UK's Cartier Awards. Turn to page 2 to read more on this exciting new initiative.

Since the publication of our last edition of RA Today, I was saddened to hear of the decision by owner Chris Van Niekerk to no longer have horses racing in his colours. Chris is a true gentleman of the sport and will be sorely missed for his composure, good humour and graciousness. We thank Chris for his huge contribution to racing and honour him on page 4.

The Racing Association has recently updated our website. The content and functionality has undergone a muchneeded revamp and we encourage members to visit the site and provide us with feedback as to what other sources of information we can add in order to make your visit to the site more engaging and useful. 2021–2022 EQUINE CATEGORY EQUUS AWARDS

TO BE STYLED ON UK CARTIER RACING AWARDS

The basis for the awarding of the equine categories for the Equus Awards from the current season (1 August 2021 to 31 July 2022) has been changed to a South African version of the UK's Cartier Racing Awards. These are awarded each year based on a combination of the following three elements:

- Pattern Race Points System
 - Expert Panel Rating
 - Public Vote

For the new South African version each of these three elements will carry an equal weighting (33,3%) in the final award calculation. The Pattern Race points system will be based on the result of the season's Graded races, followed by an expert panel rating and a public vote which will collaboratively determine the Equus Award in each of the equine categories.

The list of nominees for the expert panel rating and the public vote in each of the equine categories will be determined by points accumulated by each horse during the season in Graded races, with an exception made for the Champion Stayer category where Listed performances are also to be included. The points system will ensure that South Africa's best races are awarded the most points in each category and each horse nominated to the final voting list has demonstrated potential Champion status.

Grade 1 races will carry more points than Grade 2 races, Grade 2 more than Grade 3, open races more points than restricted-races (by age or sex), and WFA or fixed-weight races more points than conditions or handicap races of the same grading.

Additionally, certain races have been designated "Super Status" in their respective Grading in acknowledgement of their enhanced importance in the pattern of Graded races through the season. These races will carry the most points in each category and Grading.

Points will accumulate for the first-four finishers in Grade 1 races, and for the first-three in Grade 2 and Grade 3 races. Listed races which carry points towards the Champion Stayer category will be awarded for the first-three finishers except in races restricted to fillies and mares where only the first-two will be awarded points.

All Graded performances in the season will carry points towards the Horse-Of-The-Year, Age-Group categories and Male / Female categories. However, the four Distance-related categories (Champion Sprinter, Miler, Middle Distance and Stayer) will EXCLUDE performances in Age-Group restricted races and points for these categories will only accrue from races where all ages may participate.

There are currently 114 Graded races in the season from which points will accumulate for the equine awards. Of these, 29 are Grade 1, 36 Grade 2 and 49 Grade 3. Additionally, 8 Listed races over 2400 metres and further are included for points accrual in the Stayers category.

Six races at Grade 1 and two at Grade 2 level have been designated "Super Status" and will carry enhanced points. All these Super Grade 1 races are WFA races, while the two Super Grade 2 races are WFA plus penalties.

The points outlined above are summarised in the table below:

The Graded races designated Super-status are:

- the Queen's Plate (Gr 1), the Cape Met (Gr1) and the Green Point Stakes (Gr2) in the Western Cape
- the Horse Chestnut Stakes (Gr1) and the Champions Challenge (Gr1) on the Highveld
- the Gold Challenge (Gr1), the Champions Cup (Gr1) and the Drill Hall Stakes (Gr2) in KZN


Significant work has been undertaken modelling the past three seasons Graded Races results against a combination of the new points system, the known expert panel voting outcomes and a simulation of the likely spread of a public vote. This has adequately proven the suitability of the new mechanism when compared to previous Equus Awards nominees and winners. An updated table will be published monthly from the new year through the season indicating the points accumulation in each category. Final lists will be distributed at the end of the season for the voting by both the expert panel and the public.

The composition of the expert panel will be announced in due course, while details of the public vote will be communicated towards the end of the season.

The human Equus Awards and equine Breeding Categories will continue to be awarded as before based on industry statistics and will not comprise a points or public voting element. The criteria for these awards can be found on the new Equus Awards website <u>www.equusawards.co.za</u>.

HAMBA KAHLE CHRIS VAN NIEKERK



Chris van Niekerk started racing in 1993 and it was the start of a very special journey. His contribution to the business and sport of horseracing has been vast and his victories and accomplishments are too numerous to mention. To name but a few he has walked off with the Summer Cup, twice with the Vodacom Durban July trophy and is a three time winner of the Equus Champion Owner Award.

Chris was elected to the Board of the Racing Association in 2002 and held the position until 2007, serving as Chairman from 2004 – 2006. During his term of office Chris was the RA appointee to the Thoroughbred Horseracing Trust and the Phumelela Gaming and Leisure Limited Board. He also served as Chairman of Kenilworth Racing and Cape Thoroughbred Sales. He gave of himself to our industry working tirelessly and on occasions had to take hardships in his stride. But he Never Gave Up – he is a true legend and will be missed and fondly remembered. I am sure that all members of the Racing Association, past and present, join us in giving our heartfelt appreciation to Chris for his contribution to racing.

However, life was not all about hard work. Anyone who had the pleasure of socialising with him will know that he enjoys a good party. His ability in delivering memorable speeches was another one of his numerous attributes and often you would see his audiences' eyes welled with tears of emotion at the sincerity and humility of this gentleman. His words always came from the heart.

When asked about most memorable victories and some of his best horses, he singled out National Colour as having a special place. She boasted being honoured as 2005/2006 Horse of the Year and was placed second in the Nunthorpe Group 1 at Newmarket when York was rained out for the first time in its history. Other magical moments were Mythical Flight's Group 1 win at Turffontein in what is still, a course record. Carry on Alice achieved five Group 1 victories, one in each season of her racing career and then of course, the two July winners, Pomodoro and Heavy Metal in consecutive years. Chris is proud of many other special horses and Group 1 winners.

Sean Tarry was his trusted trainer and the team enjoyed a lengthy and successful partnership. Chris plans to maintain his breeding interest with Klawervlei Stud and CTS.

Chris we will miss those familiar blue and red racing silks of yours as well as your charming demeanour at the races in the parade ring and at the winners' rostrum. You deserve a rest and the time to enjoy the many happy memories that you have of successful thoroughbreds, the sport of racing as well as its people.

GAYNOR RUPERT

Well known thoroughbred racehorse owner and breeder Gaynor Rupert is the proud owner of Drakenstein Stud Farm. Established in 2003, the Stud is situated below the Drakenstein Mountains, alongside the L'Ormarins vineyards in Franschhoek. Her victories in racing have been significant and she was awarded the Equus Champion Owner Award for the 2017/2018 racing season. It was during this memorable season that the home-bred Oh Susanna became the first 3YO filly in almost 100 years to win the Sun Met and be crowned Equus Horse of the Year. Gaynor has been a member of the Racing Association since 2013. She has also been involved in the promotion of one of South Africa's most prestigious racing spectacles, the L'Ormarins Queens Plate race day hosted at Kenilworth Racecourse. Considered one of the world's great race days, it has grown over the years to what is now a two-day Racing Festival, held in early January each year.

In being recognised as October's Owner of the Month, Mrs Rupert boasted 9 winners from numerous stables during this month which included a RA Added Bonus race plus two graded races.

Seven of the nine winners are owned and bred by Drakenstein Stud (Nom: Mrs GA Rupert), namely, Silver Darling, Safe Passage, Trip of Fortune (Winner of Grade 3 Cape Classic) Amanzimtoti (Winner of Grade 2 Western Cape Fillies Championship), Quick Breeze, Lucy English and Bureau De Legende with the remaining two winners being Supreme Warrior and Cracklin' Rose (Bonus race winner).
