

TIME TO SAY GOODBYE...

It is with great sadness that we bid farewell to Mark and Dorrie Sham who have terminated their trainers' licences and racing colours.

Fortunately, many of us have happy memories of this true blue racing family. Mark has been involved with horses for over 50 years having been a farrier, bookmaker, owner, breeder and owning transport company New Turf Carriers. He has been involved in the training aspect since 2009 and has extensive experience of all sides of horseracing. This industry has been his passion for many years.

Both Mark and Dorrie served on the board of the East Cape Racing
Association and Mark was for a period of time, the Chairman of the East Cape
RA Board. Dorrie is a life member of the
Racehorse Owners Association having served in excess of the required 25 years. During Mark's term of office, he worked tirelessly for the board as well as serving on the Industry Liaison Committee to better horseracing in the East Cape by improving facilities for both owners and their horses. He was instrumental in increasing the amount of RA bonus races in the EC as well as changing the local condition so as to keep "East Cape" bonus races available to local owners and their runners.

Mark worked tirelessly towards higher stakes and more racemeetings in Gqeberha (previously Port Elizabeth). He constantly encouraged interaction between all

stakeholders in an effort to improve racing in the
Province. It was at an Industry Liaison Meeting
where the seeds were sewn to introduce
the polytrack which proved a great

success as it has resulted in many meetings being saved following inclement weather conditions.

The Committee also played a

meaningful role to improve the plight of work riders and grooms in the Province.

Mark and Dorrie met at school and they have been married for over 40 years. Dorrie, in her early days, worked as a stable-hand in Barry Steenkamp's stables. She

certainly has come a long

way since those early years. They have three sons and their boys are also involved in the horseracing industry via the transport and bedding sector.

When asked about their most proud moments in terms of their equine successes, Dorrie said that Pinnacle Peak, owned by John Finlayson who earned R800 000 in his career was

a pleasure to train and Bingwa, owned by

Colin and Lyn Stonebridge who had 4 wins and 9 places (including winning the 2021 Grade 2 Allied Steelrode — Onamission Mile) was well worthy of praise. Dorrie also had the privilege of being involved in a partnership owning Hit Song who won the SA Nursery and was soon thereafter, snapped up by an International Hong Kong Syndicate.

Farewell to this solid couple. We wish you well and hope that we continue to see you enjoying the social side of horseracing.



ROA OWNER OF THE MONTH

APRIL 2022 MARIO FERREIRA

We are proud to announce that the ROA Owner for the Month of April is Mario Ferreira following victory by Princess Calla in the Grade 1 HSH Princess Charlene Empress Club stakes run at Turffontein Racecourse on Saturday 23 April.

His Racing Manager Des Gonsalves was present to collect the trophy on his behalf as he resides outside of Gauteng. It was fitting on this royal raceday in honour of HSH Princess Charlene, that a princess in the form of four-year-old filly Princess Calla should be led into the number 1 box. We also congratulate Ashley Fortune and her team for peaking her champion at the right time.

In the post-race interview Fortune praised Ferreira who invests generously in our industry not only in financial terms but also with regard to the human element. "What a filly, what

an absolute pleasure she has been since the moment she set foot in our yard," said Fortune. "(Owner) Mario (Ferreira) and Des (Gonsalves – racing manager) they deserve this more than anybody. They are passionate, they put a lot of money into the game and I couldn't be more happy for an owner and a manager than these two."

Gonsalves was also full of praise for this committed owner saying that he has the confidence to give his racing team carte blanche in taking care of his interests.

Mario currently has 40 horses in training in various jurisdictions in South Africa, with the likes of Invidia, Juan Carlos and Westpoint all under the care of the Fortune Racing yard. He also has horses with Lorenzo Karriem and with Candice Bass—Robinson.

He has an interest in the breeding side of the industry as well and actually bred his first Grade 1 winner himself. He has recently brought in a new stallion, Declartionofpeace, whose first crop is dropping this year.

Mario has been a member of the Racehorse Owners Association for nearly 20 years, having joined in September 2012 and he currently stands 5th on the owners' log for the season having earned R 3 238 100 in total stakes. This season's racing has provided him with 30 wins and 83 places.

On behalf of the ROA we once again congratulate Mario and wish him even more success.



The Highveld Feature Season Awards Dinner will take place on Saturday, 21 May 2022 at The Venue, Melrose Arch, Johannesburg, to honour equine and human achievements during the Highveld feature race season.

The voting panel comprises Jack Milner, Robert Garner and Nico Kritsiotis. We thank them for their participation and also send our thanks to the Handicappers at the National Horseracing Authority for assisting with information required in determining the winners.

The following are the equine categories:

Champion two year old filly
Champion two year old colt/gelding
Champion three year old filly
Champion three year old colt/gelding
Champion older horse
Champion sprinter
Champion middle distance horse
Champion stayer

Nominees in the various categories will be announced after the running of Champions Day, taking place at Turffontein Racecourse on Saturday 30 April. All nominees are in contention for the much sought–after Horse of the season Award. Feature season trophies are also awarded to the human achievers. These are Champion Apprentice, Champion Jockey, Champion Trainer, Champion Breeder and Champion Owner. Work Rider of the season is also recognised at this event.

The equine categories will be deliberated by the judging panel and take into account all feature season performances run on the Highveld and the following points system will be used for the human awards:

Excitement is building as the industry has, in recent years, been forced to host virtual awards as a result of the restrictions imposed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We look forward to this social event and the pleasure of hosting and honouring the stakeholders who have played a major role in keeping our industry moving forward during these challenging times.



Adrian Todd, managing director of SA Equine Health and Protocols NPC (SAEHP), has announced the date of the European Union audit, the successful conclusion of which will allow the direct export of horses from South Africa to the European Union.

SA's director of Animal Health Dr Mpho Maja sent yesterday official notification to Todd stating, "It is our pleasure to inform you that we have confirmed availability for an audit of the animal health controls in place in South Africa in relation to the export of equidae from South Africa to the European Union (EU) from 10 to 21 October 2022." the Hong Kong Jockey Club (HKJC) for funding South Africa's continuing efforts to have the export protocols changed. "

Adrian Todd, SAEHP CEO, Todd said, "We would never have been able to reach this stage without the help of our staunch supporters and the fact that we have developed a solid Public Private Partnership with the South African Government, both at national and provincial level, combined with the support from

The Chairman of SAEHP, David Abery, said "Getting to this point in our drive to allow the export of horses from South Africa to the EU is due to the hard work and support of various role players, including our partners in the South African Government, the Hong Kong Jockey Club, the NHRA as well as various racing bodies and individuals who have supported SAEHP to date, and of course the efforts of the team at SAEHP. I would like to especially thank the Hong Kong Jockey Club for their funding of SAEHP's operations over the last year and for their insight and support during the process. I would also like to thank Adrian Todd and his team at SAEHP for their hard work and tenacity in getting us to this critical point."

Previous intended scheduling for this important audit was interrupted by the Covid19 pandemic.

However, on this occasion a physical audit will be supplemented by video or virtual options depending on Covid19 constraints.

Dr Maja is awaiting further communication from the EU inspectorate and preparations begin now in earnest preparing appropriately for the audit event.

Todd has always been confident that measures put in place to control diseases like African Horse Sickness (AHS) and prevent their spread will see South Africa passing the audit.

Dr Maja also conveyed her confidence in a successful audit outcome.


