Welcome to the June edition of ROA today.

This month, South Africans have much to celebrate, with the lifting of Covid restrictions announced last week. We can now welcome patrons back to the racecourse without any restrictions on capacity or vaccination status. How wonderful that the lifting of these restrictions has come in time for the Hollywoodbets Durban July Race Day, South Africa's beloved racing spectacle taking place on Saturday 2nd July at Hollywoodbets Greyville. With 12 races carded for the day and with 6 being Graded Races it promises to be a very exciting days racing.

England's Royal Ascot festival took place over the 14th to the 18th of June and our respected Highveld owner and Life Member of the ROA, Mary Slack, won the Hampton Court Stakes (Grade 3) on day 3 of the festival with Claymore, trained by Jane Chapple-Hyam under the ride of Jockey A Kirby. This victory could not have gone to a more deserving winner and Mrs Slack was delighted that she was present on the day to watch Claymore win going away. The following day the South Africans celebrated at the festival yet again when Candleford, trained by W J Haggas and ridden by Tom Marquand won the Duke of Edinburgh Handicap by a convincing 6 lengths. Heartiest congratulations to the Kieswetter family

who also bred Candleford at their Barnane Stud in County Tipperary.

Good news this month from 4Racing includes the announcement that www. tab4racing.com is to become the new online home of TAB betting. TAB is one of the most crucial elements of the South African horseracing industry and we urge patrons to support the TAB in order to improve revenues and therefore indirectly improve stakes and other aspects of the racing experience. www.tab4racing.com to become the new online home of TAB betting

Local horseracing and soccer punters will soon have a streamlined one stop digital shop, www.tab4racing. com, to easily place their bets and where they can get all their betting news, tips and racing info.

The www.tabonline.co.za, www.news.tabonline.co.za and www.tabnews.co.za – which has been punters' online home for many years – will be decommissioned and move to www.tab4racing.com, which will become TAB South Africa's only official betting site.

This is in line with 4Racing's strategy to have a single combined betting platform and an improved digital platform and user experience for South Africa's punters

TAB assures customers, however, that they will still be able to place their bets on TAB's main current betting portal play.tabonline.co.za.

The change will be gradual for punters, who will move from the current www.tabonline.co.za and www.news. tabonline.co.za sites to the new www.tab4racing.com site, as the migration process is completed.

All punters and horseracing stakeholders will be kept informed of the changes to the digital betting environment on TAB, 4Racing and racing industry platforms.

All TAB content vital to punters when placing their bets, including all the industry news, fields, ComputaForm downloads, race cards, tips and pools and carryover information, will going forward be housed on www. tab4racing.com.

Soccer lovers will not be left out on the new www.tab4racing.com platform, where they will be able to access team performance information and the head to head results that will help them place their Socceró and Soccer10 bets.

We have simply given you an amazing brand update which is a new way to explore horse racing and soccer via the www. tab4racing.com platform that is also mobile friendly. All the existing features on www.tabonline.co.za, news.tabonline.co.za & www.tabnews.co.za will be moving soon to www.tab4racing. com.

Q: I am a play.tabonline.co.za user, can I also use www.tab4racing.com?

A: Absolutely, TAB4Racing is building a better online home for your racing & soccer bets. The countdown has begun. Stay tuned, and you can start exploring and using the new site which will have new features, and a new way to look at the familiar bets you take. Take a bet!

Q: What is new on www.tab4racing.com?

A: Moving house is tough and www.tabonline.co.za, news. tabonline.co.za & www.tabnews.co.za have been the online home of TAB South Africa punters for years.

The new www.tab4racing.com has a new look and feel including the logo and colourway. Amazing new features include soccer and horse racing side by side. Bet sharing, a great innovation, that can bring a whole new way to interact with betting with friends and tipsters on social accounts!

New features such as enhanced information on the race card with comments, silks, jockeys, trainers and updated pool countdowns all make for informed betting. Rest assured, all of your familiar results pages, statistics and tipsters columns are all found on the TAB4Racing app and website, more of what you love in a simpler and more intuitive experience.

Q: Can I login to TAB4racing on my mobile?

A: Apple users can login to the url 'www.tab4racing.com' in your safari browser or via google, click the share button and then look for an add to home screen button. The app is now saved onto the home screen of your device.

Android users can login to the url 'www.tab4racing.com' via google search or chrome browser, click Add to Home Screen. The app is now saved onto the home screen of your device.

Q: I have downloaded the TAB4Racing app but need help to register

A: Should you be an existing TABOnline account holder, you can use your existing credentials and you do not need to register. If you do not have a TABOnline account, then click on the register button, and complete the mandatory information required. If you are a South African citizen, you will not be required to submit any information or documents in this process. Should you be using a passport, you would be required to submit a copy of your passport for FICA verification. Should your South African ID fail, you too will be prompted to submit a copy of your ID for FICA verification purposes.

Q: I have downloaded and registered with TAB and want to deposit funds

A: Should you be FICA validated, you would be able to deposit funds. Once logged in, you will have a "Deposit" function. We offer the following payment methods:

Instant Deposits
Credit Cards
Debit Cards
Instant EFT for most banks
Flash 1Voucher

Manual Deposits, which take a bit longer to reflect on your account. We have bank accounts with the 4 major banks in South Africa. All of the details are available on the deposit page.

Q: I have downloaded and registered with TAB, funds have been deposited and now want to take my first bet, can you help me?

A: Once clicking either the "Horse" or "Soccer" icons, you will have all available betting events in the scroll down window. A new tab feature has allowed betting events to open earlier to allow you to take a bet before the day of the race. Select the venue and race in which you would like to take a bet, and the same for Soccer betting.

Once on the fields page, ensure that you have selected your bet type with the many bet options such as win and place bets, swingers, trifectas, and quartets, and big pool betting such as the Bipot and Pick 6 are all available.

After selecting your bet type, highlight your horse selection/s. enter the amount times you want to take the bet or the Rand value you want to spend, depending on the bet type. Click on Place Bet.

A bet confirmation will be shown as soon as the bet Is placed successfully.

Should you require any assistance, There is a feedback button on the mobile app where you will be assisted directly within the app. To contact Customer Care call: 0861 444 822 or email customercare@4racing.com.

Q: How do I calculate my Pick6 bet amount?

A: A Pick6 is calculated at R1 a line.

For example, if you chose one horse in each of the 6 races i.e 1/4/6/2/4/6 this would cost you R1 and you would have to ensure that you take it for at least the minimum amount required, you can also take this bet for more.

Should you take a Pick6 permutation i.e. 1,2/4/4,6,7/1,2/8,9,10/1,2 this would be calculated as follows: Each leg is a multiplication of the units in each of the previous legs, that is leg 1 is multiplied by leg 2, that result is then multiplied by the unit/s in leg 3, that result is then multiplied by the unit/s in leg 4 and, so on for a total of 6 legs.

With a multiple entry, you can choose more than one option in one or more legs. The cost is R1 per combination/line. To calculate the number of combinations, multiply out the total number of options or choices for each leg to calculate the cost of the bet.

Pick6 bet 1,2/4/4,6,7/1,2/8,9,10/1,2 will be calculated as follows 2*1= 2, 2*3= 6, 6*2= 12, 12*3= 56, 56*2= R72.
The Total bet will cost R72 for 100% of the bet.

Q: Can I open a TAB4racing betting account at a TAB branch?

A: Yes, you can! The Customer Care team and tellers can help you with creating your account, remember that you will need documentation to FICA this account.

Q: Can the Tab Customer Care place a bet for me with funds in account?

A: No.

Customer Care cannot take a bet for you. You need to call the Telebet Call Centre on 0861 000 822 or 011 434 8400.

Q: How do I retrieve my account number?

A: Should you have forgotten your account number, this can be retrieved by using the "Forgot Account" function. You will be required to provide your ID number and then provide the email address or phone number linked to your account. You will be provided with a sms/email with your account number should it be linked to the information provided.

Q: What are the banking details for an EFT and what reference should I use when making payment?

A: If you bank with one of the big four South African banks, you no longer need to take the risk of carrying cash when you collect your winnings or when you go to make a deposit to your TAB account.

When you bank with ABSA, First National Bank, Nedbank or Standard Bank, you can ensure your safety and security by linking your betting account and your bank account. This will enable you to transfer directly to and from each account.

Add 4Racing as a beneficiary or nominated account payee. The various bank account details are listed below.

The benefit: you can transfer funds as you would for any other payment.

For added convenience, credit card transfers are also possible if your card is linked to your bank account.

NB: Always use your betting account number as a reference. Please remember that as with all banking transactions, after hours transactions are registered immediately, but only reflected during normal banking hours.

Q: What race cards are available to me on TAB4racing.com and the TAB4Racing App?

A: We have the standard and abbreviated racecards available currently on the news.tabonline.co.za and will be migrated to the TAB4racing.com shortly.

The ComputaForm Express and ComputaForm is a comprehensive "Rolls Royce" betting information

guide and this too will be available on TAB4racing.com.

For specific International meetings, there will be course specific race cards available.

Q: Where will I find the Tote results page that I usually go to on TAB4Racing App?

A: This can be found under "Toteboard" or "Past" should the event be completed for the day.

240

Racing 240 audience up 24% on Tellytrack numbers in first independent viewership report

4RacingTV's horseracing channel, Racing 240, recorded a unique reach of 462 221 viewers between the tracking period 18 April to 26 May 2022, as reported by Nielsen Sports, the global leader in research and data intelligence.

Jean Willers, Nielsen Sports South Africa Managing Director, said Racing 240's viewership was 24% higher than its predecessor Tellytrack (372 445 viewers) over the same period in 2021.

"Since being added to the Broadcast Research Council's (BRC) panel of channels, we are now able to accurately analyse and report on independently verified audience numbers," says Willers, who said Racing 240 had shown a strong performance in its first month of being tracked and independently verified.

Racing 240, which launched on DStv on 19 January 2022, has been attracting new viewers on a daily basis. The top performing broadcast to date was the "World Sports Betting Maiden Plate" race day at Kenilworth Racecourse on 20 April 2022, which attracted a unique audience of 66 025 viewers.

The initial TV viewer profile indicates that the horseracing viewer mirrors the demographic profile of all South Africans, with 51.9% male viewers and 48.1% female viewers of the channel.

The average age of Racing 240 viewers is 40 years old and the highest percentage of viewers came from KwaZulu Natal (25%), followed by the Western Cape (19%), and Gauteng and North West (12%) and Eastern Cape (10%).

"We are encouraged by Nielsen's first report on Racing 240. We will continue to engage with the various industry stakeholders, our existing racing community and our targeted audiences to shape our content and channels. Measuring the impact of any change is key and we will continue working closely with Nielsen to regularly assess and report on this," said Stephen Watson, Head of 4Racing.TV'.

Racing 240 will broadcast the showpiece Hollywoodbets Durban July on Saturday 2 July.

2022 EQUUS AWARDS

The Equus Awards organising committee have begun in earnest with preparations for the South African Horseracing's premier awards. The event will take place on Wednesday, 24th August 2022 at The Emperors Palace Convention Centre

The basis for the awarding of the equine categories for the Equus Awards from the current season (1 August 2021 to 31 July 2022) has been changed to a South African version of the UK's Cartier Racing Awards. These are awarded each year based on a combination of the following three elements:-

- Pattern Race Points System
- Expert Panel Rating
- Public Vote

For the new South African version each of these three elements will carry an equal weighting (33,3%) in the final award calculation. The Pattern Race points system will be based on the result of the season's Graded races, followed by an expert panel rating and a public vote which will collaboratively determine the Equus Award in each of the equine categories.

The list of nominees for the expert panel rating and the public vote in each of the equine categories will be determined by points accumulated by each horse during the season in Graded races, with an exception made for the Champion Stayer category where Listed performances are also to be included. The points system will ensure that South Africa's best races are awarded the most points in each category and each horse nominated to the final voting list has demonstrated potential Champion status

The Equus Committee is also pleased to announce that we will once again be featuring the media award categories.

4Racing announces six additional August race meetings

Johannesburg, 22 June 2022

4Racing is pleased to announce that it plans to schedule an additional six race meetings during August across its two regions as follows:-

- Tuesday 9 August Turffontein Standside
- Thursday 11 August Vaal Classic
- Friday 12 August Fairview Polytrack
- Tuesday 16 August Turffontein Inside
- Friday 19 August Fairview Polytrack
- Tuesday 23 August Vaal Main Track

In addition, Cape Racing has scheduled an additional racemeeting at Kenilworth on Saturday 20 August

In doing a reforecast of stakes for the financial year March 2022 to February 2023, 4Racing has projected an underspend of its originally allocated stakes budget – due to a combination of weather enforced abandoned races / race meetings and the replacement of better quality races carrying higher stakes (that failed to attract sufficient runners) with lower quality races carrying lower stakes.

When the original fixture list for 2022 was published at the end of last year, there was a necessary reduction in the number of 4Racing fixtures due to the decline in the horse population. This was achieved by getting rid of most double header Saturdays (in favour of stand-alone meetings) as well as a two and half week break from racing during August on the Highveld, Western Cape and Eastern Cape.

With signs of a reversal in the horse population downward trend in both regions and the forecast stakes savings for the year, 4Racing has made the decision to fill some of the blank days in August, thereby providing additional opportunities for all stakeholders.

Each of these added race meetings will be aimed predominantly at the lower rated horses in each region (in line with the demands of the horse population) – with stakes set at R60,000 per race.

The updated National Fixture List for August as well as race programmes for these race meetings will be released in due course.

Heroes Resting Place

We commend 4Racing for their decision to restore the equine cemetery at Turffontein Racecourse where the legendary hero Aquanaut and Turffontein lead horses Caradoc, Furious and Beau Art were laid to rest.

Caradoc filled the role as lead horse with dignity for close to 11 years (1971–1982). Older visitors to Turffontein may remember the days when this majestic horse would come onto the track at the sound of the trumpet to lead the field on the parade.

Beau Art replaced Caradoc as lead horse alongside Furious who was a Holiday Inns Winner in 1978. The other fine champion of the turf, Aquanaut, was from the first crop of Foveros, one of the all-time great sires to have stood in this country. Aquanaut won his debut in early 1986 and landed 6 victories from his first 9 runs. He came to a tragic end when he was fatally injured on the eve of his fourth OK Gold Bowl race.

Honour for Bold Silvano

THE Eastern Cape–bred Bold Silvano has been honoured with the renaming of the popular upstairs venue at the Fairview Racecourse.

"It has been decided to rename the HB Christian Room the BOLD SILVANO ROOM," announced Promotions Manager Karin le Roux. "The name is more in line with current trends and compliments our other venue, the HEAR THE DRUMS, named after the locally trained super sprinter (East Cape Horse of the Year in 2007 & 2009)," Le Roux explained.

Bold Silvano was bred at Ascot Stud in Nelson Mandela Bay, started his racing career with top Fairview trainer Gavin Smith. He went on to win the Vodacom Durban July of 2010 in the care of internationally renowned conditioner Mike de Kock. "Bold Silvano is probably the most famous racehorse from Port Elizabeth (now Gqeberha) of the modern era," Ashley Parker, joint owner of Ascot Stud with his mother Rose, said when attending the races at Fairview. "The renaming is an honour for Bold Silvano. It is a good thing for racing to have his name as part of Fairview and Nelson Mandela Bay Racing." Smith feels the renaming is not only an honour for Bold Silvano, but also for the Eastern Cape, Ascot Stud and Gill Thompson (Bold Silvano's first owner). "And for myself. The room will be named after Bold Silvano and it's going to be around for years. It is quite an achievement and it is lovely to be a part of it," Smith added.

Thompson was originally Bold Silvano's sole owner. The first time she saw him at Ascot Stud, she felt he was a special horse and she just had to buy him. Smith also saw Bold Silvano at Ascot. "I loved the way he moved and wanted to try and buy him at the sales. "Gill and I were sitting opposite each other at the sales. We were bidding on the same horse, so I phoned her and asked if she was bidding on this one. "When she said yes, I said ok, I will leave it to you then. Afterwards she came to me and said you can train him for me.

"What a lovely horse. He did really well here before he went on to a greater level and to do greater things. "We will always remember him starting as a big, big baby here. He took some time to find his feet but when he knew what it was all about, he did some great things." Bold Silvano won the Grade 3 (now Listed) Champion Juvenile Cup and Listed Racing Association Stakes in fine style in 2009 in Smith's care. Parker also remembers Bold Silvano's sensational start in the Eastern Cape very well. "He was sold as a yearling and started with Gavin, won very good races here and Gavin took it to Cape Town." After running unplaced in his Cape Summer campaign it was then decided between Gill and Gavin that he would go to Mike de Kock, and be prepared for the big races in Durban.

Even the then President of South Africa, Jacob Zuma, saw something special in Bold Silvano and had a lovely winning bet in the July on this legend! "Bold Silvano went to Dubai after his July win. After his first win in Dubai he was the favourite for the Dubai World Cup," Parker recalled. "Jockey Christophe Soumillion reported that Bold Silvano put up unbelievable work in his last gallop but unfortunately an hour later the groom reported the horse to be very sore. "He fractured a bone in his hock and was locked away for six months. He returned to training but felt his hock again and retired to Ascot Stud.

"Bold Silvano had good success but ended up being infertile and was retired back to Gill's farm (in Bathurst). He will be there for the rest of his time," Parker said.

JUNE 2022 Peet Boonzaaier

It's not every day that an owner walks away with a Grade 1 win under their belt but on 4 June, our Owner of the Month, Peet Boonzaaier along with his partners Mr C J Lensley, Mrs EL la Grange, Mr GG Palmer and Mrs D Palmer were totally elated when their colt Alesian Chief (Vercingetorix (SAF) - All in the Mind (SAF) by Var (USA) won the Golden Horse Sprint (Gr1) at Scottsville Racecourse. Corrie Lensley is also the much respected trainer of Alesian Chief who had Muzi Yeni in the saddle. Alesian Chief has had 13 runs and achieved 5 wins (including a Grade 3 and a Listed) and 4 places.

Boonzaaier became a member of the ROA in February 2018. He was truly honoured during the week when I told him that he was our Owner of the Month. He is in partnership with 10 and owns about 5 racehorses outright at Corrie Lensley's stable. He also has horses with Steven Moffett, Lucky Houdalakis and Ashley Fortune in Gauteng.

His interests are not restricted to Gauteng and he has horses with Cliffie Miller in Eastern Cape, Carl Hewitson in KZN and Vaughn Marshall, Candice Robertson, Brett Crawford and Adam Marcus in Western Cape. Peet also owns horses with Terry Evans' stable in Australia.

He became involved in racehorse ownership in 1996 with Glen Puller and owned a couple of horses with him for about 5 years but for some reason, he lost interest and left the game. He claims that was the biggest mistake he had ever made but he has certainly made up for it now. His first ever

winner came from the Puller yard – a horse called Red Gold East.

For the moment, he is only involved in racing thoroughbreds but he and his partners are considering sending some of their mares to stud to notch up their game. Horse racing is like a second life for him. He is very passionate about horse racing so it is not simply a hobby but an integral part of his life.

From a personal perspective, Peet owns a roller door manufacturing company. He and his wife, Anne, have 3 children – Petrus, who is his right hand man, Michelle, their daughter who lives in New Zealand and the apple of his eye Linda who he says is his late foul.
