Trainer / Owner Contract

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why should I sign a training agreement?

Owners often have a lot of questions about their training fees and the management of their horse in racing. This contract sets out the horse racing industry practice which protects trainers, owners and horses so it is advisable to have an agreement in place with your trainer.

2. What does a monthly training fee include?

The monthly training fees usually include stabling, bedding, training, groom's costs and feeding of your horse. The training fees vary from trainer to trainer and are set out in Schedule B. The trainer will tick a box if any additional items are included in your training fee, however, most of these items may be separate so it is important to understand what the owner will pay for in addition to the standard items.

3. What additional fees will an owner be liable for?

Additional fees may include farrier costs, transportation costs, equine dentistry, vet services, equine physiotherapy, equine therapists, equine chiropractor, race entries, National Horse Racing Authority Fees (for racing colours, change of ownerships and authority to act) and/or raceday expenses.

4. Can a trainer charge a commission for wins and places in races?

If a trainer wants to charge a commission in addition to the racing operator's deductions, the trainer must get an owner's permission in Schedule B and disclose what the percentage of the prize money this commission will be.

5. What is sale commission?

If a horse becomes valuable due to its performance and because the trainer has done a good job of training the horse for an owner(s), some trainers may require a sale commission to be paid to them if the horse is sold, which is a percentage payable to the trainer by the owner(s).

6. If a horse earns prize money (ie stakes and any other money made available) in a race, where does this get paid to?

A trainer and an owner must agree who will receive the prize money. If a horse earns prize money and the trainer is receiving the prize money, the trainer must credit the owner's statement and pay over the net amount due to the owner within 5 days of receiving the prize money.

An owner may request that the prize money be paid directly to him/her or, in the case of multiple ownership, the owners may request that their relevant portion of the prize money is paid to each individual owner in accordance with their percentage ownership in the horse.

7. What is an authority to act?

This is a standard document issued by the National Horse Racing Authority that must be signed by an owner(s) or the manager to give a trainer authority to train a horse. There is a fee that must be paid by the owner on signing and submission of this form.

8. Is a trainer allowed to geld a horse if the horse is a colt or a stallion, without an owners permission?

A trainer must get the permission of an owner or manager to geld a horse. If multiple parties are owners in a horse, the trainer may obtain the permission of the majority owner or the holder of the largest percentage in the horse as this person is deemed to be the manager of the horse, unless the owners have decided on a particular manager. In the case of a syndicate, the nominee of the syndicate will be allowed to make the decision. If the owner is a company, the nominee for the company will be allowed to make the decision to geld a colt or a stallion.

9. Can a trainer sell a horse if an owner has not paid their account?

Yes, a trainer can sell a horse if an owner has not paid their account. A trainer has to give an owner a notice of breach before he can sell the horse in terms of the Training Agreement and must follow the steps in the Training Agreement before s/he is allowed to sell the horse.

10. Do I need to insure my horse?

Insuring a horse (such as in the event of the horse's death or if requiring life saving surgery) is not mandatory but may be advisable depending on the amount paid for the horse or if it becomes valuable as a result of its racing performance and racing career.

11. What happens to my racehorse if the owners agree to retire their racehorse?

There are several options available to owners for racehorses for retirement.

- a. Sometimes trainers will take ownership from you of the horse and then undertake to feed your horse and care for it while they find a good home for your horse. It is a good idea to discuss this with your trainer and agree with the trainer that he can take ownership of the horse on condition that it gets retired and that he finds a good home for the horse.
- You can also pay a donation to the East Cape Horse
 Care Unit or provide a donation to the Highveld Horse
 Care Unit, and they will undertake the care of your
 horse as they have programmes for adoption of your
 horse where they ensure that the horse finds a great
 home
- c. If the horse is a mare and has a good track record, you may consider selling the mare on an auction with Bloodstock South Africa in which case she may attract buyers, depending on her health and track record for breeding purposes. At this point, if the mare has achieved black type, she may be attractive for breeders to purchase for purposes of breeding and the proceeds can be paid to the owner(s) pro rata to their shares or to the nominee for distribution to the owners. You will have to identity a suitable auction and pay the trainer to keep the horse in the interim or place her in suitable stabling whilst you are making these arrangements. You can discuss these arrangements with your trainer and the auction house.
- d. If your horse is a colt or a stallion (entire) with an
 excellent track record of black type (having won group
 races and placed multiple times), you must discuss
 this with an expert for breeding purposes. Typically,
 your trainer will help you make arrangements for

- the stallion management and agreements must be put in place for this purpose. You can also discuss this with experts in stallion management to decide the best way forward.
- e. If you want to keep your horse after racing, you must arrange suitable stabling to ensure your horse is well taken care of. You can discuss the needs of your horse with your trainer.
- f. If your horse is retiring due to injury and is likely to recover, but may not be fit for racing, you can discuss this with your trainer and your vet and obtain a second career assessment form from the vet which will determine what activities the horse may be suitable for in future after recovery.
- g. In the unfortunate event of your horse suffering a lifethreatening injury and a vet recommends euthanasia, your trainer and vet will make humane arrangements for your horse.

12. What is the procedure for retirement of a racehorse?

A qualified vet must complete a second career assessment form which says that the horse may be suitable for various second career options. This second career assessment form must be arranged by the trainer and filed with the National Horse Racing Authority. If the horse leaves the training facility, a copy of this form must be furnished with the horse to its new home. The form with the name of the new owner must be provided to The National Horse Racing Authority by the trainer. The National Horse Racing Authority must pass this information onto the National Racing Bureau to reflect the change of ownership.

2023 Betway Summer Cup — First Entries

A total of 40 entries, headed by defending champion
Puerto Manzano (ARG) and Hollywoodbets Durban
July champion Winchester Mansion, were received on
Wednesday for the R5 million Gr1 Betway Summer Cup.

The 2023 Betway Summer Cup is the flagship of the Highveld season and is set to take place at Turffontein Racecourse on Saturday, 25 November 2023.

Defending champion Puerto Manzano (ARG) heads the line-up. The 6yo son of Seek Again made his seasonal debut in the Betway Get Way More Pinnacle Stakes at Turffontein on 16 September, conceding a welterweight 12kgs to finish 2.25lengths second under regular big race rider, Gavin Lerena. Puerto Manzano (ARG) is trained by Johan Janse van Vuuren and races in the well-known silks of Messrs J F & L M F Wernars & Mrs T J Wernars.

He is joined by Hollywoodbets Durban July hero, Winchester Mansion, owned and bred by Drakenstein Stud and trained by Brett Crawford.

Other Gr1 winners include Anfields Rocket (WSB SA Classic, 2023), Bless My Stars (Wilgerbosdrift SA Fillies Classic, 2023), Safe Passage (Daily News 2000, 2022), Aragosta (SA Derby, 2022), Son Of Raj (SA Derby 2023) and Cousin Casey (Premiers Champion Stakes, 2022).

Of particular interest is Cousin Casey. The son of Vercingetorix was named Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in 2022 and has recently joined the Sean Tarry string at Randjesfontein. Tarry has nominated five runners and could have a strong hand with the likes of Cousin Casey, Bless My Stars, Litigation, Nebraas and talented stayer Future Pearl.

Mike de Kock has nine Summer Cup titles to his name, but has not won the race since Flirtation's victory in 2010. He fields seven entries — Safe Passage, Aragosta, Dave The King, East Coast, Shoemaker, Union Square and up-and-coming Trois Trois Quatre. Safe Passage may have been a touch unlucky in last year's race when finishing a 0.50-length second to Puerto Manzano. If he regains his best form, the Silvano gelding will be a massive runner.

Life Member Profile

LIFE MEMBER Satch Mathen

In the captivating world of horse racing, there are individuals whose passion for the sport becomes a lifelong commitment. Satch Mathen, a cherished Life Member of the Racehorse Owners Association, embodies this dedication and is our featured Life Member for September.

Satch's passion for horse racing traces its roots back to his childhood in Durban. It was his late father who first introduced him to the thrill and excitement of the turf. Together, they ventured to Greyville Racecourse, where young Satch's fascination with the sport took root.

When Satch was 14 years old, he moved up to Pretoria from KwaZulu Natal and has lived in the capital ever since. He is the Founder and CEO of Matekor (Pty)

Ltd, which is one of the largest industrial equipment suppliers in the South African and African construction industry.

While racing undoubtedly holds a special place in Satch's heart, his interests extend beyond the track. He finds joy in the world of golf, and spending time with family. Family is very important to Satch, his two sons are avid race goers and also enjoy the sport. His nephew, Dayalan Chinsammy who is an ROA member for many years and was our owner of the month just a few months ago, is a racehorse owner whom Satch introduced to the sport as a youngster.

Past trainers of Satch include Spike Lerena, Mike de Kock, Sean Tarry and Mike Azzie. Some newer trainers he has entrusted his horses to include Robyn Klassen and Candice Bass-Robinson as he is trying to support women in racing. A few of the iconic horses owned or part owned by Satch throughout the years include 2000 Gr1 SA Oaks winner Cyber Cento, 2018 Gr1 Summer Cup winner Tilbury Fort and Willow Magic (AUS) who won the Gr1 SA Nursery and the Gr2 Dingaans in 2013. It is these special wins which have contributed to his favorite racing memories to date.

Satch applauds the ROA's proactive stance in encouraging young people and more women to become more involved in racing. Traditionally perceived as a male-dominated field, horse racing has been undergoing a positive transformation in recent years. The ROA's efforts to engage and empower women within the racing community have been commendable. He also enjoys seeing the encouragement in Syndication which would be beneficial to the sport.

We thank Satch for his contribution to the sport over the years, and especially to the ROA for the unwavering support.

ROA OWNER OF THE MONTH

Justice Mushwana



Each month, the Racehorse
Owners Association recognizes
one dedicated owner who has
shown unwavering commitment to
the sport. This month, we turn our
spotlight on Justice Mushwana, a
recent member of the ROA but not a
stranger to the industry.

Justice's connection with the ROA began in 2003 when he served as an administrator at the Racing Association, appointed by Colin Gordon who has taught him everything about thoroughbreds. He mentions how the job introduced him to legendary racing individuals such as Graeme Hawkins, Peter Miller and James Maree who has done so much for the industry. While he may have left the organization for a

time, his heart never truly departed from the racing world. He returned as a member, bringing with him a wealth of knowledge and a renewed enthusiasm for the sport. He enjoyed following champion horses like Jet Master, Badger Land and Horse Chestnut who were leading stallions at the time.

The Racing Association at the time, started the Sinead Syndicate for the Late Ernie Anderson which introduced to the staff the opportunity to participate as owners at a small contribution. This was the first time Justice and his family were involved in racehorse ownership and later down the line, the Captain Peg partnership began.

Captain Peg winning his first start has been Justice's favorite racing memory thus far. He currently owns partnership shares in 5 horses which are all stabled in Gauteng. Justice credits much of his success and enthusiasm for racing to his trainer, Stuart Pettigrew. Pettigrew not only guides Justice in racing but also encourages other owners to form partnerships when purchasing horses at sales, creating good relationships and friendships along the way.

Justice now works for the City of Joburg and has many business interests. He comes from a family steeped in legal tradition, with practicing attorneys and advocates among his relatives.

Justice has been deeply impressed by the ROA's commitment to furthering the interests of owners. He sees the organization as not just a governing body but also as a community of like-minded individuals who share a common love for horseracing. Justice encourages fellow owners to get more involved in forming new partnerships and learning about the evolving needs of owners in the sport. He would like to see the ROA more involved in new ownership development initiatives which he believes is essential to the future of racing. He believes racing is a sport for everyone and the industry requires active participants to survive.


