The South African Equine Health and Protocols (SAEHP) announced the reinstatement for the direct export of horses out of South Africa to the European Union. This is a landmark development and I'm very proud to note that the ROA has supported this initiative over several years. The ROA contributed in excess of R5,8 million to SAEHP since 2018 and we are delighted with the knock-on effect this will have throughout the entire value chain of racing, the opportunities for international racina success for our owners as well as the overall advancement in equine health standards in South Africa. I must acknowledge all of the other funders and thank the team at SAEHP, under the leadership of Adrian Todd and David Abery for getting this over the line. Direct Exports from SA to EU Approved



South African Equine Health and Protocols (SAEHP) is pleased to provide an important and exciting update regarding the reopening of European Union (EU) export markets to the various equine disciplines in South Africa.

SAEHP, in conjunction with the South African Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development (DALRRD), advises that DALRRD has received official notification that the reinstatement of direct exports of registered equines from South Africa to the EU has been approved.

This official notification followed a meeting of the EU Commission Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed - Controls and Import Conditions Section whereby the EU Member States endorsed the Commission's proposal for an amendment to Annex IV of the Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/404.

This amendment places South Africa's African Horse Sickness (AHS) free zone back on the Annex IV list as an authorised zone within South Africa from which registered equines are authorised for direct entry into the EU following the required in-country preexport guarantine period.

It is 13 years since South Africa was last able to export registered equines directly to the EU. SAEHP was formed in 2018 and has been working with the South African Government for the past six years to achieve this export milestone. It has taken longer than originally anticipated, with the main reason being that Covid affected the first official EU audit timing, scheduled for 2020, but with the audit rescheduled and carried out in 2022 and subsequent communications between DALRRD and the EU authorities, the reinstatement of direct EU equine exports has now been granted. The most challenging hurdle has now been surpassed, and the implementation of exports will be straightforward.

The workstreams to achieve this success have been long and complex. SAEHP would like to sincerely thank the South African Government, DALRRD, the Western Cape Veterinary Services, SAEHP's various funders in South Africa, The Hong Kong Jockey Club, the National Horseracing Authority (NHA), the Kenilworth Quarantine Station, the Thoroughbred Breeders Association as well as all the participants in the audit process, the laboratories,

trainers, stud farms, registering authorities (NHA, Stud Book, and South African Equestrian Federation), stop over quarantine facilities and last but not least the SAEHP board members, management and staff for together achieving this important outcome.

This is a very positive development for both the South African thoroughbred racing industry as well as for other equine disciplines in the country and the re-opening of normal trade will have many benefits, including in time the creation of further jobs in this employment intensive industry.

The reinstatement of direct exports to the EU may lead to other export markets deciding to invest in South African horses, either by exporting via the EU or exporting directly from South Africa. This will lead to greater interest in South African yearlings and horses in training of all equine disciplines, benefiting breeders and owners who choose to either sell to overseas buyers or compete internationally.

Dr Mpho Maja, Director Animal Health at DALRRD, said "I am very pleased with the outcome; this shows that when we work together, we can achieve what is thought to be impossible. I send my gratitude to the equine industry and provincial veterinary services for the support provided in ensuring compliance to the requirements. I look forward to our horses flying the flag internationally and making us all proud."

David Abery, Chairman of SAEHP, said "This is very exciting news, and thank you to everyone involved in making it happen. It is anticipated that this opening up of direct EU exports will, over time, give a significant boost to not just the South African thoroughbred racing and breeding industry, but also to the other equine disciplines, all of which have been somewhat internationally isolated for many years."

"It is vital that what has now been achieved is maintained, and we look forward to working with all relevant stakeholders to ensure the functions of SAEHP are well funded and developed as required, so that we can support industry in maximising the value which flows from an efficient and strong horse export system."

Notes: This EU amendment will come into effect after publication in the Official Journal of the European Union which is expected to occur shortly. SAEHP will advise when this publication has been made.

The pre-export quarantine period will take place at the existing Kenilworth Quarantine Station, exports will be then able to take place from the AHS free zone in Cape Town directly to the EU. Further information will be disseminated in due course.

Melandie Taljaardt

In the competitive world of horse racing, where victory is often measured by a short-head or a nose, there are individuals who stand out not just for their success, but for their passion and dedication to the sport of racing. This month's owner of the month is Dr Melandie Taljaardt, who is one of these individuals who is always there to shout her horses home on raceday.

Growing up, Melandie always had the ambition of becoming a wildlife veterinarian. As a vet student, Melandie attended an endurance event and was amazed by how athletic and versatile equines are. She also rode in a few endurance events and represented Gauteng at the Tri-Nations event over 120km. Melandie was then introduced to racehorses and has never looked back. Melandie is currently a veterinarian specializing in equines and owns shares in her parents' macadamia and pecan nut farm.

Currently, Melandie owns six horses in an individual capacity and is also involved in partnerships in an additional eleven horses with dear friends. Lucky Houdalakis introduced Meladie to owning her first racehorse, NINJARA, a 2014 bay filly by GREYS INN (USA) x TRIANGULAR SERIES (SAF), who was also her first winner. Lucky went on to produce a few more winners for Melandie. Michael and Adam Azzie then got Melandie involved in shares in RIVARINE, who she described as such a blessing, as the son of VAR(USA) was her first Grade 1 winner when he galloped home to win the GR1 Computaform Sprint on 27 June 2020 as a 6-year-old gelding. Corne Spies has trained SNOW PALACE, who Melandie part owns and describes as one of the most special fillies she has ever owned. Melandie will never forget when this daughter of POTALA PALACE won the 11th race, under

the beaming lights of Hollywoodbets Greyville Racecourse on July Day in 2022.

Fanie Bronkhorst currently conditions all of Melandie's horses and they are all stabled on the Highveld as she enjoys having all of her horses in one yard and close to her. She is appreciative of the care and attention he provides her horses with, along with attention to detail to what each horse's training requirements are. Fanie has also given Melandie the most winners as an owner to date. Her success as an owner is evident, with an impressive tally of 11 winners for the season thus far, following an equally impressive 23 winners in last season, including DANCING DORA who has won 4 races in a row. Every win is special and

memorable to Melandie as she follows her horses journeys every step of the way. She says winning a Grade 1 race is every owner's dream, so RIVARINE'S win ranks at the top for her. Another memorable win is DARK TIDE, winning the Heritage Consolation on 5 December 2020. Melandie also mentions that having winners with first time owners will always be special.

Family is extremely important to Melandie, her parents have been married for 39 years, she has two beautiful sisters and amazing brother in laws, along with three nieces and one nephew who get spoiled by their aunt. Melandie is a very passionate owner and says as humans, it is sometimes easy to forget how magnificent these animals are, and in return all they need is to be loved and cared for. She urges owners to visit their horses when they have any time available, to give them big hugs and show them the love and appreciation they are so deserving of.

LIFE MEMBER Darren Simpson

The Racehorse Owners Association continues to feature our Life Members each month, we always enjoy learning about how the sport has become part of their lives and why they still love it so much. This month, we are thrilled to catch up with Darren Simpson.

Darren was born in 1962 in the United Kingdom and relocated with his family to South Africa in 1970. He attended St Henry's Marist Brothers in Durban and went on to study at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. Darren was introduced to the racing industry through his father, William Simpson, who enjoyed the occasional flutter. Winning the first bet he was involved in, being a Place Accumulator, Darren thought he was a multi-millionaire, and the bug had bitten.

While being a university student, Darren was a part-time cameraman at Greyville, Scottsville and Clairwood which has subsequently been sold. He said it was a fantastic job, became a real eye opener into the world of racing, and also inspired him to become a racehorse owner. While having many favorite racing memories, Darren recalls a first timer named CASA GRANDE, who raced at Clairwood in 1998, trained by the Alexander brothers and ridden by Rhys van Wyk. Darren and his father watched this horse run a phenomenal race, winning by 5,75 lengths. Darren had become involved with the Alexander family when he

and they became good friends. They asked Darren to be part of their first racing syndicate "The Alexander Ascot Syndicate", and Darren had shares in five horses including CASA GRANDE who they sold to buyers in Hong Kong. Other horses include WINTER CHASE, FOREST EDGE and ELEGANT AL, who won the Grade 2 Premier's Handicap at Turffontein on 2 October 1999. Darren mentions that the best horse he was a part of was CHAMPAGNE HAZE, who he had the pleasure of owning with classic owners Laurence Wernars and Bruce Gardner. This son of KAHAL won the Emperors Palace Ready To Run Cup in 2015, the shares in 14 horses split between Grant Maroun, who has produced many winners for Darren, Paul Matchett and more recently, former top jockey and newly licensed trainer Mark Khan, who had his first winner as a trainer on Classic Day with SEA SHANTY, who is also part owned my Darren, and he is elated to be part of that history. John Maroun is a good friend of Darren's and the driving force in the partnerships that he is involved in.

In 1986, Darren moved from Durban to Gauteng and worked for global logistics and international shipping company DHL. In 1990, Darren and his best friend Brian Hull started a courier/logistics company called Hull's Express Freight, which has been renamed DCB Logistics as Brian had to unfortunately retire in 2014 due to illness. Today, DCB Logistics has a national footprint with 14 strategically placed branches across South Africa. There is not a day in South Africa that DCB trucks will not be seen travelling the roads of South Africa moving urgent parcels between cities. Darren still heads up DCB. Along with his horseracing hobby "moving parcels" is all Darren knows. He has three children who are all grown up and live abroad, Tamara is in the Isle of Man, Justin is in Jersey, and Trent is in London. Darren explains that it is not easy (and also quite expensive) to coordinate trips to visit them, but they all love the horseracing experience. Darren's fiancée, Karen, is an avid racing fan and loves dressing up for the big days. He notes that his remaining racing ambitions are to have another runner in the July, to win a Grade 1 race, and to attend a top-class race meeting in the UK.

Outside of racing, he is an avid sports fan. He follows soccer (Pirates and Middlesbrough), loves rugby and is a Sharks fan. He is also a very keen golfer, as he lives and plays on a great course outside of Benoni. He also tries to stay fit by going to the gym, running and swimming. He loves cooking and enjoys quality wine, as well as collecting (and drinking) fine whiskies too. Darren finds solace in travelling and will soon be going, with his sons, to play golf in Marrakesh, to celebrate one of his son's 30th birthday.

"Being a member of the ROA has been a privilege. My family and friends really enjoy the facilities and it's a great way to spend an afternoon. The whole of the ROA staff go out of their way to make you feel special and privileged, along with the improved communication. I think they have done sterling work to assist in keeping racing alive!
