R1 MILLION IN ADDED STAKES BONUS RACES

The ROA adds an additional R 1 Million in Bonus Stakes Benefits for the remainder of the 2023/2024 season.

We are delighted to announce the continuation of our immensely popular Bonus Stakes Initiative into June and July 2024.

The total amount of R1 Million will be made available to Open Maiden Plates (excluding A Division and Juvenile Maiden Plates) run in 4Racing jurisdictions.

ROA OWNER OF THE MONTH

MAY 2024

Clive Murphy

The month of May produced exciting feature racing in Gqeberha on the TAB East Cape Derby Day, which also included the running of the Dahlia Plate Listed race run over 1200m. In a gutsy finish between two runners both trained by Gavin Smith, KINGDUNDEE was victorious over HAPPY HOLLY. This month we are thrilled to feature Clive Murphy as our ROA Owner of the Month, the owner and breeder of KINGDUNDEE (THE UNITED STATES (IRE) x MISS MARMALADE).

Clive's journey into racing started in 1976 when he worked as a horse handler at the starting stalls at the KwaZulu Natal racecourses. He also spent six months working as an assistant trainer to Dean Latimer who was quite involved in harness racing in South Africa. These experiences have sparked a deep interest in the breeding and genetics of racehorses. Clive has had his racing silks for 36 years and has been breeding on a

small scale for 27 years. His initial strategy into breeding focused on purchasing fillies with promising racing careers and later sending them to stud. However, five years ago after teaming up with trainer Gavin van Zyl, Clive pivoted towards acquiring fillies with robust pedigrees. Their new approach emphasized mating these high-quality mares with genetically superior stallions, specifically Group 1 winners known for producing exceptional runners. This meticulous strategy aimed to enhance the genetic potential for speed and performance in their horses. The first tangible success of this strategy is embodied in KINGDUNDEE. This horse represents the fruition of their dedicated breeding plan and is the culmination of years of improvement in their breeding. Clive added that this is also a testament to Gavin Smith's abilities as a trainer.

Clive currently owns shares in three horses which run on the Highveld and in the Eastern Cape, he also owns three

mares who are all currently in foal. Whilst Gavin Smith currently trains the majority of his horses, Gavin van Zyl has also produced many winners for Clive in KwaZulu-Natal.

Now retired, Clive continues to enjoy the sport that has brought him countless memorable moments. Over the years, he has celebrated significant successes with horses like KENTUCKY POWER, BLACK WING and DANCING FEATHER. Yet, the pinnacle of his achievements is undoubtedly the triumph in the prestigious Dahlia Plate. This win was especially sweet as Clive has bred KINGDUNDEE as well as MISS MARMALADE, the dam of this 2-year-old colt.

We thank Clive for his continued support and wish him all the best with his racing and breeding endeavors!



Life Member Profile

LIFE MEMBER Altus Joubert

The Racehorse Owners Association is delighted to feature the distinguished Advocate Altus Joubert as our Life Member for the May edition of ROA Today!

Altus grew up in the scenic town of Ceres, renowned for its thriving racehorse breeding and fruit farms, where his father was a country doctor. His family knew the Freemans of Daytona and the Cohens of Odessa very well, for Dr Joubert was their doctor and, in time, the families became friends. There was no veterinary surgeon in the district. In consequence, from time to time, he even treated horses. This was in the early 1950's. In time, Dr Frank Freeman and his brother's wife, Dr Mariaan Thompson, became the veterinary surgeons at Ceres. Both were also significant thoroughbred breeders in their own right. Altus says one of his earliest childhood memories was seeing the stallion MEXICO II (sire of the legendary sprinter and sire HARRY HOTSPUR) at Daytona.

After completing university, Altus served with distinction in the army for two years during the time of the Angolan war. He then joined the Johannesburg Bar in 1981, taking silk in 1993. His expertise and dedication have seen him serve as an acting judge on multiple occasions since 1996. He is currently the Group Leader of Maisels Group, comprising 130 advocates. During 2001 to 2002 he was Chairman of the Johannesburg Bar Council, by far the biggest Society of Advocates in South Africa. I asked him about his life as an advocate. He responded by saying: "I chose my profession well and life at the Bar has been kind to me. To this day I love going to chambers and

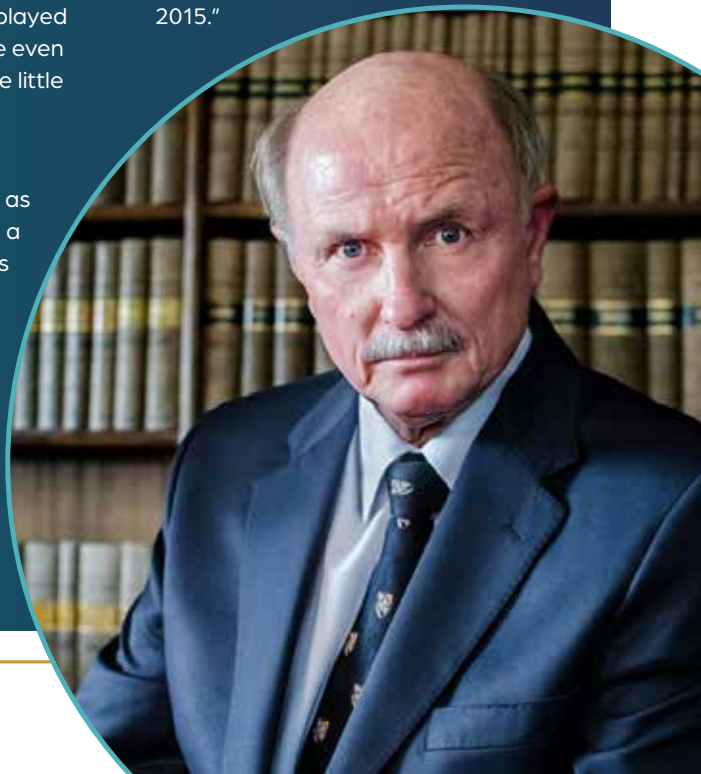
enjoy the cut and thrust of running cases". "But", he adds, "to run a busy practice at the Bar effectively, calls for a brutal work ethic and a lot of discipline. I rise at 4am. My secretary, Helene Schreuder, who is a star, starts work at 6am. Usually I'm at chambers by then. I try to go home by no later than 7:30 pm, but it does not always work out that way. This regimen has been borne of necessity. An advocate, almost always, works to stringent deadlines. You have to stay ahead of the beat, almost at all costs, otherwise life can quickly become a misery." But then he adds, philosophically: "Nonetheless, the pleasure of knowing that, sometimes, you actually make a difference to people's lives, in a positive way, is greatly satisfying. It is a good life to live".

Beyond his legal career, Altus is a man of varied interests and an insatiable curiosity. His love for history is matched by his passion for visual art and literature, making him an avid collector of both. Altus's love for classical music, particularly opera, has also played a significant role in his life. He even produced "La Traviata" in the little amphitheater at his farm.

Altus is also an enthusiastic educator. He views teaching as both a wonderful calling and a great craft, and he dedicates significant time to sharing his knowledge and skills with others. Altus chaired the Board of Governors of Jan Celliers Primary and Pre-Primary School for almost 20 years. His passion for teaching also found an outlet in lecturing at universities. He was

appointed Visiting Professor of Law by the University of Stellenbosch for the period 2001 to 2004. For the past 23 years he has been a Professor of Law at the University of Potchefstroom, now Northwest University, presenting the LLM-course in Import and Export Law. Some 140 students graduated under his tutelage.

Outside of racing, Altus loves sport, to play and to watch. He played tennis at a provincial level and also represented Stellenbosch University in tennis, cricket and chess. He summited Kilimanjaro a month before his 50th birthday. He describes it as "physically the toughest thing I ever did". Altus is a great fan of the Springboks. He joyously says that he was there when South Africa won the World Cup at Ellispark (1995), Stade De France in Paris (2007 and 2023) and at Yokohama in 2019. "Those are memories to savor", he says, but then adds: "I was also there when, sadly, we lost 18-20 in the semi-finals of the World Cup to the All Blacks at Twickenham in 2015."



Having served as the Chairman of the Thoroughbred Breeders Association and Chairman of the National Horseracing Authority, we asked Altus about memorable highlights whilst serving the administration of the sport and industry over the years. He says he is proud of the progress made whilst he was Chairman of the TBA (then including Bloodstock SA). Asked to highlight some, he says that the finances were turned around dramatically, from a debt of some R3 million to no debt and reserves to close on R16 million; the substantial improvement of the Sales Complex as Gosforth Park; the creation of the world class museum at the Sales Venue and re-engaging with other international thoroughbred associations, after a break of several years. Altus has elaborated on the important decisions that were made during his time as Chairman of the NHA. There were many, he said, but to him there are two standouts: First, the NHA increased the minimum riding weight for jockeys, because the very low weights were unhealthy and unsafe. "We were not the first country to do so, Ireland was", he said, "but we followed Ireland's example within a month or so". Second, for many years the "three strikes and you're out" principle of "doping" transgressions of trainers could and sometimes did have harsh and unfair consequences, because no adequate distinction was drawn between performance enhancing drugs and other medications. A sub-committee lead by Jonathan Witts-Hewinson was tasked to consult with vets, trainers, attorneys and all other interested parties to create a fair and predictable schedule of offences and the punishment related to them. "This was ground-breaking work", says Altus, "which I shared with the chairmen of the National Horseracing Authorities of other countries." Variants of South Africa's schedule have since been adopted elsewhere in the world. The magnitude of Altus' contribution to the administration of the sport is probably best highlighted by the fact that he was only the 2nd person (the first being Allan Robertson) to have served as chairman of the TBA and chairman of the NHA.

At Riethuiskraal, a farm near Stilbaai, he developed a stud farm. Across the Goukou river, on the other side of Riethuiskraal, is Kransfontein, where he developed an olive farm and renovated old farmhouses for hospitality purposes. This, Altus says, is his little paradise. Pressure of work permitting, he visits the farms every six weeks or so. His breeding of NATIONAL COLOUR (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY x RAINBOW CAKE) came about in this manner. He says he purchased a parcel of mares from Paddy Hinton, in the main to obtain RAINBOW CAKE. David Ferraris told him that she was the fastest filly he had ever trained. David even had a painting made of her, which Altus subsequently bought from him. He wanted to breed a proper speedster, Altus told me. Consequently, he bred her to National Assembly, the best sprinting sire in South Africa at the time. He repeated the mating four times. One of the matings resulted in National Colour. Altus was on course when, as a 3YO filly, she pulverized the field in the Computaform Gr1. He said: "I vividly remember asking Sean Tarry in the ring before the race whether NATIONAL COLOUR is not taking on a bit much with older horses and champion sprinters CATALOOCH and NHLAVINI being in the field. He looked at me, knowingly, and said: 'She is not here to make up the numbers.' And so it proved. Her winning three Gr1's in one year (two of them against colts) is still one of my enduring pleasures. I followed her racing career as if she was still my filly, because, in a sense, she was. I sat at the table with her owner Chris Van Niekerk and trainer Sean Tarry when she raced at Nad Al Sheeba in Dubai, at Royal Ascot where she was competitive in the King's Stand Stakes Gr1 and at Longchamps when she ran in the premier sprint race in Europe, the Prix de L'Abbaye. She was rated the Champion older filly in Great Britain for her exploits on the tracks of England. When two of her sons (RAFEEF and MUSTAAQEEM) ran at Turffontein and both won Gr1's on the same day, I was on course. My pleasure was as great as if I owned them. Her daughter and many other members of her family are broodmares at Riethuiskraal."

One of the first horses that Altus Joubert bred, was LAMBARINA (DANCING CHAMP (USA) x FIRST PARTY), from Odessa's famous PARTY TIME family. He kept and raced her, trained by Ormond Ferraris and ridden by Jeff Lloyd. His family was on course when LAMBARINA won the Oaks Trial and a few weeks later also won the South African Oaks, as odds-on favorite. This, he says, was his first taste of having bred, owned and raced a classic winner, and the taste lingers on. Several members of LANBARINA'S family are now broodmares at his stud farm. In recent times he raced VISTULA, WAY OF THE WORLD, NAVAL GUARD and MARSHALL FOCH. Largely, he breeds racehorses to sell them, but from time to time he retains fillies from his breeding stock to preserve the bloodlines for the stud. His enthusiasm is palpable. He says: "Breeding racehorses is an exhilarating endeavor, but it requires a lot of patience and even more perseverance. Building up a broodmare band takes years, if not decades. Selecting good stallion shares and covers is a mixture of sound judgment and a lot of luck. Ultimately, making the best possible mating of stallion and broodmare on phenotype (largely conformation and temperament) and genotype (largely genetics), is like playing chess with nature. Good husbandry of horses, especially when they are very young, is critical. And, after all of that, you sell the colt or filly. Although this may seem to be a little crazy, it isn't really. The breeder of a good horse has always been recognized and honored throughout the history of the thoroughbred. Breeders follow the careers of horses they have bred as if they still own them. Great pleasure and pride is generated by their achievements." It is, Altus says, certainly true for him.

We thoroughly enjoyed learning more about Altus and wish him many more successes in his career and within the racing and breeding industry!

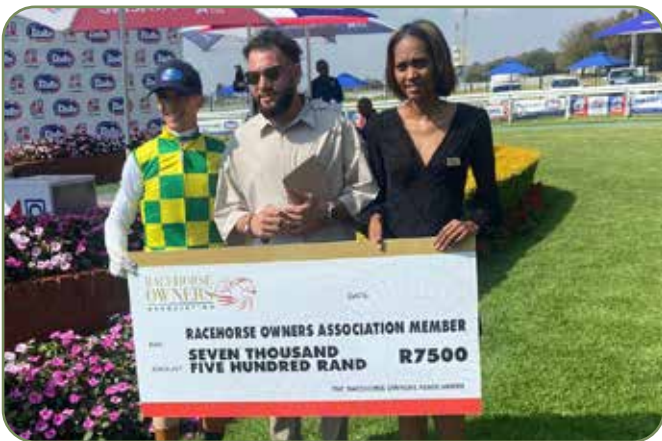
